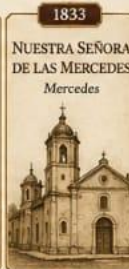
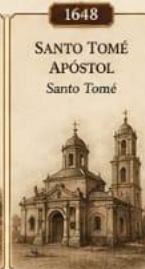
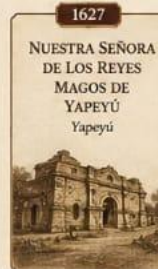

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS



1588 – THE FOUNDING

The city of Corrientes was founded on April 3, 1588 by Capitán Juan Torres de Vera y Aragón. The Matriz Church was the spiritual heart of the province.



1627–1648 – JESUIT MISSIONS

Yapeyú and Santo Tomé were part of the Jesuit–Guaraní mission network, evangelizing the Guaraní people and creating enduring Catholic communities.



SAN ROQUE: THE INLAND HUB

Founded in 1773, San Roque became a major inland curato, with jurisdiction over vast territories including Goya and Curuzú Cuatía in its early years.



RIVER & FRONTIER EXPANSION

Between the late 18th and early 19th centuries, parishes were established along rivers and frontiers as population expanded and new settlements grew.

DID YOU KNOW? ¿SABÍAS QUE?



Itatí is one of Argentina's most important Marian pilgrimage sites, drawing millions of faithful every year in devotion to Nuestra Señora.



The Jesuit missions in Yapeyú and Santo Tomé were centers of education, agriculture, music and spiritual formation for the Guaraní people.



San Roque's parish church of San Roque de Montpellier still stands today, a living testament to the faith of early settlers.



The Paraná and Uruguay Rivers were the lifelines of Corrientes, connecting communities and enabling the growth of new parishes.



Many of these early parishes preserve centuries-old baptismal records—treasures for genealogists and future generations.

This chart focuses on the Colonial to National period up to ~1930, preserving the true historical roots of Corrientes' Catholic heritage.
